Preti Taneja

Preti was born in the UK to Indian parents and has worked as a human rights reporter and film-maker in Iraq, Jordan, Rwanda and Kosovo. Her novel, *We That Are Young*, won the Desmond Elliot Prize for a debut novel.



Nancy MacLean

Nancy is an award-winning author and the William Chafe Professor of History and Public Policy at Duke University. Her most recent book is *Democracy in Chains*, telling the intellectual origins of America's 'great right wing conspiracies' with Nobel Prize winning economist James Buchanan in the 1950s. She is a popular US commentator on the current right wing tactics.



Robyn Douglass

Robyn Douglass trained on local and community newspapers after studying art history and English literature at Melbourne Uni. She moved to Adelaide in 1991, and edited the Anglican Church newspaper, the Guardian, while finishing a journalism degree. She freelanced for a number of organisations, including ABC Radio National, while raising her children, and was publications manager at Anglicare SA for five years. Eight years ago she joined News Corp as a subeditor, working for The Advertiser, the Sunday Mail and interstate papers. She has worked in all areas of paper and digital production, moving into the Lifestyle (food and wine) section in 2018.
